## BILL SUMMARY

- Designates the month of May as "Maternal Mortality Awareness Month."


## CONTENT AND OPERATION

## Maternal Mortality Awareness Month

The bill designates May as "Maternal Mortality Awareness Month." According to the federal Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, about 700 women die each year in the United States as a result of pregnancy or delivery complications. Research suggests that half of these deaths may be preventable. Women in the United States are more likely to die from childbirth or pregnancy-related causes than other women in the developed world. At present, racial disparities exist, as the risk of pregnancy-related death for black women is three to four times higher than the risk for white women. ${ }^{2}$ In Ohio, the ratio of pregnancy-associated deaths has increased since 2008. According to the Ohio Department of Health, in 2016, there were 84.7 deaths per 100,000 live births. ${ }^{3}$
