- Requires the Ohio History Connection to designate John Glenn's childhood home as a state historic site.

CONTENT AND OPERATION

Designation	John and Annie Glenn Historic Site.
Designee	John Hershel Glenn, Jr.'s childhood home, 72 West Main Street, New Concord, Ohio.
Other information	Requires the Ohio History Connection to make the designation in recognition of the life of Mr. Glenn, an Ohio native, decorated Marine Corps aviator, astronaut, and United States Senator, and to mark the site, or cause it to be marked, in accordance with the marking system established for designated historic sites within Ohio.
