Prohibits RU resellers from engaging in redistribution or resale of electricity upon purchase from a utility provider at a specific location or premises unless an EDU waives its first refusal rights established under the PUCO waiver rules (R.C. 4941.02(D)).

Requires PUCO to adopt rules governing the process for an EDU to waive its right of first refusal to build the distribution facilities needed to serve an individual end-use customer in lieu of an RU reseller (R.C. 4941.03(C)).
	Limitations on effect of R.C. Chapter 4941. a	and PUCO rules
R.C. Chapter 4941. and rules effect purchases of utility service through a competitive provider (R.C. 4941.11)	Provides that nothing in R.C. Chapter 4941. or PUCO rules prevents an RU reseller from purchasing a component of utility service through a competitive provider at a rate that is different than the rate for that component under the utility provider's <i>standard service offer</i> if the RU reseller obtains a waiver and complies with PUCO rules. Proprietor arrangement with TPBS	No provision. RU reselling (R.C. 4941.01(H))	Defines RU reselling as a person charging an occupant for billing and provision of utility service. Includes situations in which (1) submeters or only a master meter is used, and (2) a proprietor contracts with another entity to assist with billing and provision of utility service. Excludes situations in which an occupant is a direct customer of a utility provider or is charged for a utility service by a TPBS.	Defines RU reselling as a person charging an occupant for billing or provision of utility service. Includes (1) situations in which (a) submeters or only a master meter is used, and (b) a proprietor contracts with another entity to assist with billing or provision of utility service, and (2) an entity that is not a utility provider and that meets either of the following: <ul> <li>It provides utility service;</li> <li>It is owned or controlled by, or affiliated with, an entity that provides utility service.</li> </ul> <li>Excludes situations in which an occupant is a direct customer of a public utility or in which an entity only charges an occupant for TPBS.</li>			
TPBS	Defines TPBS as any person, corporation, or other entity charging an occupant on behalf of a proprietor (1) the amount for utility service that does not exceed the actual cost of the service provided to the occupant, and (2) a reasonable monthly administrative fee as part of the standard monthly charge, such as rent or condominium-association fee (R.C. 4941.01(K)).	In the definition of a TPBS, changes the monthly administrative fee to a <i>reasonable monthly cost included in the occupant's standard monthly charge.</i> Defines TPBS to exclude both (1) an entity that provides utility service, and (2) an entity that is owned or controlled by, or affiliated with, an entity that provides utility service. Electric services company as a utility provider	No provision.	Defines "utility provider" to include an electric services company (R.C. 4941.01(O)(3)).			

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Standard monthly charge	Referred to charges "such as rent or condominium-association fees," but did not define the term (R.C. 4941.01(H)(1) and (K)(2) and 4941.09(A)(1) and (2)).	Defines "standard monthly charge" to mean an occupant's regular payment to a proprietor for the use or maintenance of property or land, such as rent or a condominium-association fee (R.C. 4941.01(J)).
Standard mercantile rate (R.C. 4941.01(I))	Defines "standard mercantile rate" to mean, with respect to a utility service provided to an RU reseller by a utility provider, the mercantile rate collected in the immediate service area from merchant customers for utility service of the same type and quantity.	Changes "standard mercantile rate" to refer to the mercantile rate collected from <i>mercantile</i> customers instead of <i>merchant</i> customers.

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
